Someone once said, "The only constant thing is change". Mission work is no exception. Actually, if change is not happening, the work is not advancing. The

changes happening are a result of your gifts, prayers and labor. Here is a rundown of our current

construction projects and a look at the future.

- The multi-purpose building in El Cercado is nearing completion. We are hoping to be able to put the building to use early this fall.

We are now working on teams and funding to complete this project.

- The CCED classroom project is also rapidly coming to an end. We are currently working on funding to help purchase windows and doors and to finish the electrical work. This building will be ready for students this fall.
- The classroom project at the Jim Smith School in El

Rosario is coming to an end as well. We are hoping to have those two classrooms finished for use this fall.

- The Lucille Rupp School is the newest construction project. Our winter teams have been working on a security wall at the school. We still need some funds and teams to help complete that project.

- There are a couple of projects currently on the drawing board. Planning is underway for a new clinic/hospital to replace the current site that was flooded nine years ago. We are also working on the need for an additional two classrooms at the Emmanuel School in San Juan.



Here is Another Part of Our Work

Medical teams have also been a big part of the SRM ministry. From January to March, the clinic hosted 7 medical teams and 6 surgical teams. Many poor people received care. Most important is many made decisions to accept Christ. We are grateful for the help these professionals provide.

The clinic in San Juan is currently adjusting its facility and its programs for the new nationalized healthcare system. We are looking forward to seeing how this improves healthcare in the Dominican Republic.
